1.0 Abstract Preparation

Prospective authors should submit a one page abstract. The abstract should summarize the scope of the submission and the benefit to the attendees. Final presentations must be in MS PowerPoint 97-2003 format.

2.0 Important Deadlines

Abstract deadline: **February 5, 2010**
Acceptance notification: **February 15, 2010**
Final presentation deadline: **March 15, 2010**

3.0 Author Registration

Each lead author must establish an account with a username and password at <http://www.easychair.org/conferences/?conf=cp20100>. The lead author then logs in to the EasyChair system to actually submit the abstract, and later, the final presentation.

Upload paper

The paper must be in the PowerPoint Presentation format (file extension .ppt). If you submit only an abstract, then tick the **only abstract** box, else upload the paper.

The file name, including the directory part, must contain only Latin-1 characters. If it contains any other (for example, Chinese) characters, then some browsers will not pass the file name correctly and you will get error messages.
